

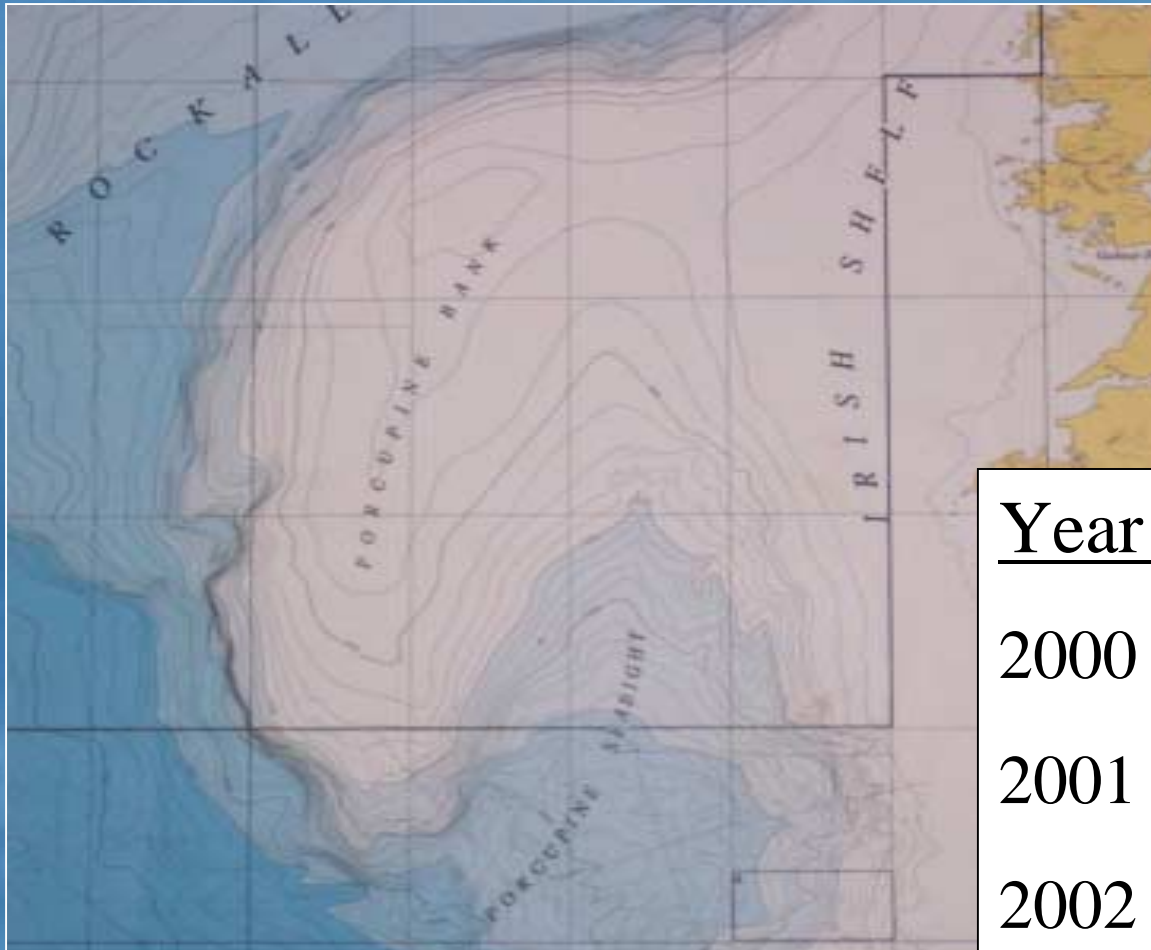

- 1) Steering group
- 2) Capacity building
- 3) Initial industry contacts/experience
- 4) Strengthening relationships/cooperative data
- 5) Formal discourse
- 6) Multi-stakeholder collaboration



# 1) Steering group – agencies, international scientists and professional partners:

- Semi-independent – auditing/accountability
- Skills – advice, experience, contacts
- Regular meetings – **adaptability**, strategy
- Practical agendas – focused, pragmatic

## 2) Capacity building – scientists and agencies with international scientists:

- International experience and expertise
- Developing domestic skills in fisheries
- Building professional contacts

### 3) Initial industry contacts – scientists and agencies with users:

- Informal environment
- Independence of scientists
- Experiential knowledge
- Access to vessels



## 4) Strengthening industry relationships:

- At-sea discussion
- Experiential knowledge
- Informal expression of needs
- Cooperative data collection



## 5) Formal discourse - Agencies with users with scientists:

- Boardroom environment
- Selected stakeholders – non-regulatory
- Presentations and discussion
- Formal opportunity for ‘voice’

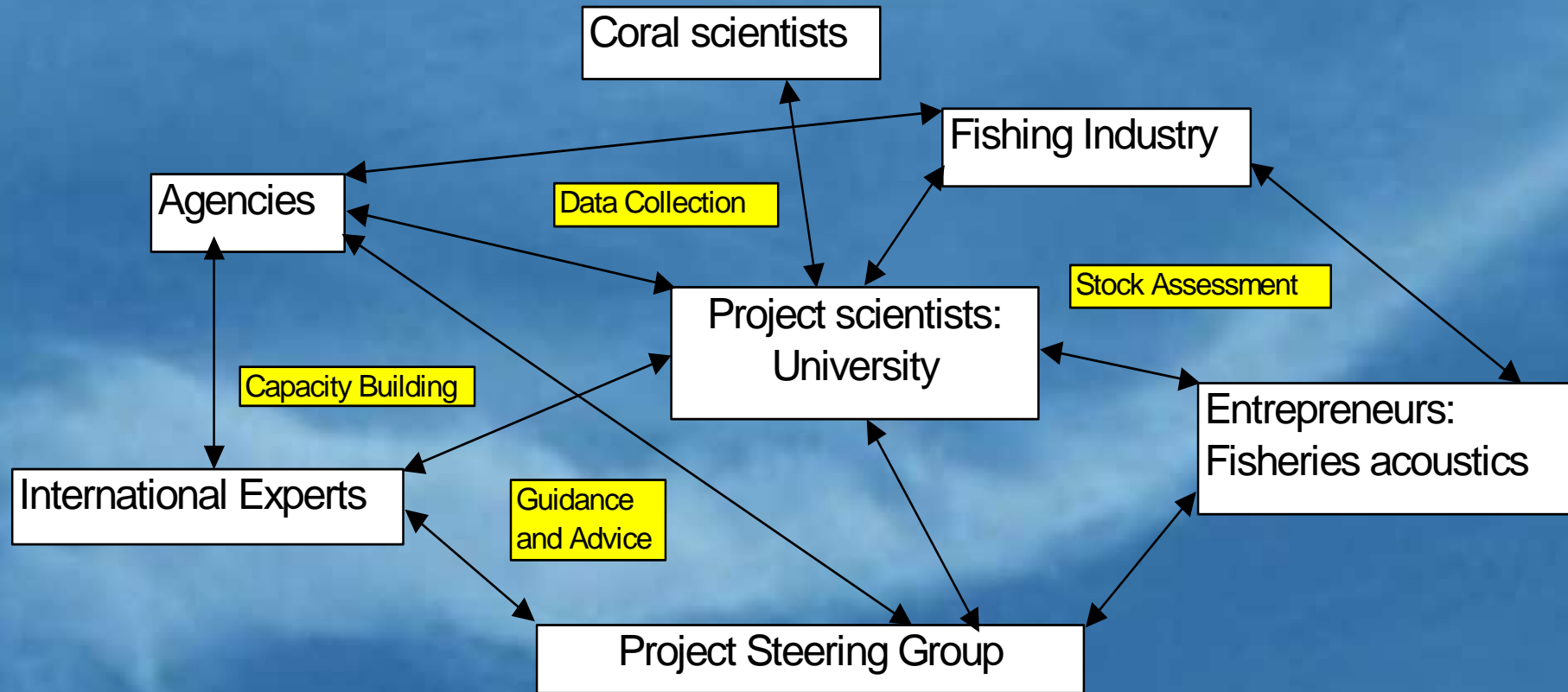


## 6) Multi-stakeholder collaboration in research survey:

- Commercial and research vessels
- All stakeholders
- Mutual sharing of data
- Indirect mediation between stakeholders
